NOTES

Thank you so much for choosing my Pineapple Succulent Planter pattern! I came up with this pattern as a fun summer project, just in time for end-of-the-year teacher gifts! The pineapple is a sign of “welcome” to others and represents friendship, hospitality, and warmth. With a cute little succulent, it is perfect for gifting to others or displaying as an accent in your home!

I recommend reading through all instructions before starting your design. This pattern uses the bobble stitch for the body of the design, so you will need to be familiar with this stitch. Popping the bobbles is what gives the design such great texture!

MATERIALS

HOOK(S)

3.75 mm • US size F

YARN

Weight : Worsted

Hobby Lobby, I Love This Cotton Yarn in Curry
~ 40 yards

- I opted to use cotton yarn as it will dry easily when watering the succulents. You could use other types of yarn (ie. acrylic) as well, but they may turn out a little bigger than the pattern as written for the cotton yarn.

NOTIONS

Darning Needle

Scissors

Stitch Marker

Succulent Plant

(pattern works for succulents in the 2-2.5 in range)

- I found my succulents at Trader Joe's and Home Depot. Trader Joe's has minis (2-2.5 in) in ceramic pots. You will want to take the succulent out of the ceramic pot and just use the plastic planter to insert into the finished pineapple. I have also found 2.5 in planters at Home Depot.

GAUGE

To make a 2x2 square -
ch 11. Sc x 10 across. Ch 1. Turn.
Repeat x 10 rows (11 rows total).

FINAL HEIGHT

~ 3 inches tall

ABBREVIATIONS

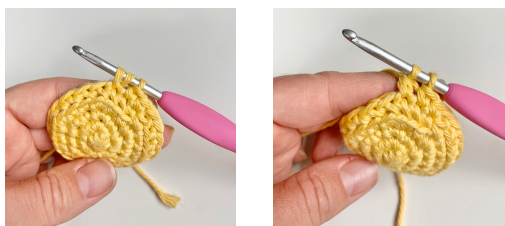

SPECIAL STITCHES

BOBBLE STITCH (bobble):

To make a bobble stitch you will work four double crochets into the same stitch.

To begin, yarn over and insert hook into the stitch. Yarn over and draw up a loop. This leaves three loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through the first two loops (two loops left on hook).



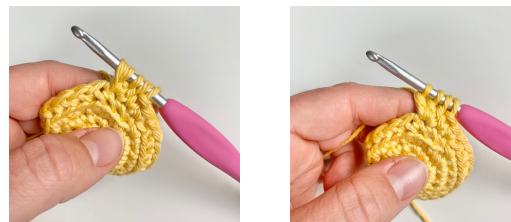
Yarn over, insert hook into the stitch. Yarn over and draw up a loop, leaving four loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through the first two loops (three loops left on hook).



SPECIAL STITCHES

BOBBLE STITCH (cont'd):

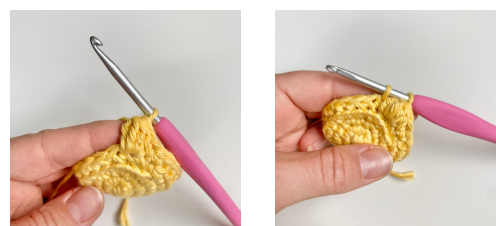
Yarn over, insert hook into the stitch. Yarn over and draw up a loop, leaving five loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through the first two loops (four loops left on hook).



Yarn over, insert hook into the stitch. Yarn over and draw up a loop, leaving six loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through the first two loops (five loops left on hook).



Yarn over and pull through the five loops on the hook. Pull stitch tightly and it will create a bobble. The bobble should be pushed toward you so that it is on the outside of your work.



SPECIAL STITCHES (cont'd)

BACK LOOP ONLY (BLO):

Insert hook into the back loop only of the stitch.

When looking at the "v" of the stitch, you will place your stitch only in the side of the "v" farthest from you (the back). Draw up a loop. Yarn over and pull through two loops on hook. This will create a "ridge" on the base circle of your planter.



INCREASE STITCHES (inc):

To increase stitches, you will sc or hdc 2 stitches into the same spot. This allows the shape to become wider. To do this, complete your first stitch (whether it be sc or hdc) as you typically would. Place a second stitch in the same spot, so that you are left with two stitches where previously you had one stitch.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

When creating my planter, I prefer to make my bobbles on the right side. You can choose to make them on the right or wrong side - just make sure that the bobbles are on the outside of the body when you finish your piece! This may require you to turn your body inside out.

This pattern is worked in the round. There is NO join at the end of each round. In order to keep the bobbles in a spiral pattern, and not falling on top of each other, the pattern is not a simple repeat! I recommend using a stitch marker for the beginning of each round. If you have any questions at all, feel free to reach out!

Some testers used Sugar N' Cream cotton yarn for their patterns and had a difficult time getting the final piece to stretch over the planter due to the thickness of the yarn. You may need to stretch the piece prior to inserting the planter, or use a larger hook if the piece seems too tight. If your planter pot has a "lip" on the edge, you may have difficulty getting the final piece to pull over the lip. In this case, omit the final row of back loop only stitch, to maintain a wider opening at the top of the piece.

If you would like to make your piece for a larger planter, continue the initial increase rows (in increments of six stitches) until you have a circle slightly larger than the diameter of your succulent base. Crochet in the back loop only around. To start the bobble rows, divide the total number of stitches in your circle by three, to give you the number of bobbles you should have in your rows. To add height to the final project, you will need to continue to add rows being careful to pay attention to prevent the bobbles from landing 'on top' of each other.

PATTERN (For 2 Inch Planter)

Stitch counts are included at the end of each round. Bobble rows include [total # stitches, # bobble stitches]

You will not join at the end of each round. You will continue to work in the round.

- Round 1** To begin, make a magic ring. Place 6 sc in the magic circle. [6]
Do not join. You will continue to work in the round.
- Round 2** [inc] in each st around. [12]
- Round 3** [inc, sc] x 6 around. [18]
- Round 4** [inc, sc x 2] x 6 around. [24]
- Round 5** sc in the BLO in each st around [24]
- Round 6** [sc x 2, bobble] x 8 [24, 8 bobbles]
- Round 7** [sc, bobble, sc] x 8 [24, 8 bobbles]
- Round 8** [bobble, sc x 2] x 7, bobble, sc, bobble [24, 9 bobbles]
- Round 9** [sc x 2, bobble] x 7, sc, bobble, sc [24, 8 bobbles]
- Round 10** [sc, bobble, sc] x 7, bobble, sc x 2 [24, 8 bobbles]
- Round 11** [bobble, sc x 2] x 6, bobble, sc, bobble, sc x 2, bobble [24, 9 bobbles]
- Round 12** [sc x 2, bobble] x 6 followed by [sc, bobble, sc] x 2 [24, 8 bobbles]
- Round 13** [sc, bobble, sc] x 6 followed by [bobble, sc x 2] x 2 [24, 8 bobbles]
- Round 14** [bobble, sc x 2] x 5, bobble, sc, bobble followed by [sc x 2, bobble] x 2 [24, 9 bobbles]
*If you feel like you need to place a sc after your final bobble in round 14, you can do that and then continue to round 15 with the BLO stitches.
- Round 15** sc in the BLO in each st around. Fasten off, leaving a long tail to sew in. [24]



PATTERN (For 2.5 Inch Planter)

Stitch counts are included at the end of each round. Bobble rows include [total # stitches, # bobble stitches]

You will not join at the end of each round. You will continue to work in the round.

- Round 1** To begin, make a magic ring. Place 6 sc in the magic circle. [6]
Do not join. You will continue to work in the round.
- Round 2** [inc] in each st around. [12]
- Round 3** [inc, sc] x 6 around. [18]
- Round 4** [inc, sc x 2] x 6 around. [24]
- Round 5** [inc, sc x 3] x 6 around. [30]
- Round 6** sc in the BLO in each st around [30]
- Round 7** [sc x 2, bobble] x 10 [30, 10 bobbles]
- Round 8** [sc, bobble, sc] x 10 [30, 10 bobbles]
- Round 9** [bobble, sc x 2] x 9, bobble, sc, bobble [30, 11 bobbles]
- Round 10** [sc x 2, bobble] x 9, sc, bobble, sc [30, 10 bobbles]
- Round 11** [sc, bobble, sc] x 9, bobble, sc x 2 [30, 10 bobbles]
- Round 12** [bobble, sc x 2] x 8, bobble, sc, bobble, sc x 2, bobble [30, 11 bobbles]
- Round 13** [sc x 2, bobble] x 8 followed by [sc, bobble, sc] x 2 [30, 10 bobbles]
- Round 14** [sc, bobble, sc] x 8 followed by [bobble, sc x 2] x 2 [30, 10 bobbles]
- Round 15** [bobble, sc x 2] x 7, bobble, sc, bobble followed by [sc x 2, bobble] x 2 [30, 11 bobbles]
*If you feel like you need to place a sc after your final bobble in round 14, you can do that and then continue to round 15 with the BLO stitches.
- Round 16** sc in the BLO in each st around. Fasten off, leaving a long tail to sew in. [30]

For BOTH Sizes:

Sew in your tail. Carefully place your succulent inside of your pineapple planter and pull up to cover.
